### LOWELL AREA FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES BOARD MEETING MINUTES Monday, June 8, 2015

### 1. ROLL CALL

Jim Herb called the meeting to order at 3:35 p.m.

Members Present: Jim Herb, David Pasquale, Matt Mayer, Susan Reister, Tim Wittenbach and Carlton Blough

Others Present: Jerry Hale, Frank Martin, Bob Rogers, Shannon Witherell, Corwin Velzen, Steve Bukala and Suzanne Olin

### 2. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

IT WAS MOVED BY PASQUALE and supported by MAYER to approve the agenda. Yes – all. Motion Carried.

### 3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

IT WAS MOVED BY BLOUGH and supported by MAYER to approve the minutes of the May 11, 2015 meeting as corrected. Yes – all. Motion Carried.

### 4. FINANCIAL REPORT.

Olin presented the financial reports.

IT WAS MOVED BY PASQUALE and supported by REISTER to approve the financial reports as presented. Yes - all. Motion Carried.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT. There were no public comments.

### 6. OLD BUSINESS

A. <u>Discussion and approval of purchasing procedures</u>. Wittenbach mentioned records should be kept for at least three years. He also mentioned reverse auction. Wittenbach stated his township board requested it be in the agreement. Herb felt this item was addressed in item 9.

IT WAS MOVED BY MAYER and supported by REISTER to approve the purchasing agreement as presented. Yes – all. Motion carried.

B. Review of grant research proposal. Herb mentioned the original presentation was a bit confusing. Blough felt Olin's firm can widen the scope on grants since he has more avenues. Herb questioned if the department had any other wish lists. Martin responded Wildland gear, equipment for a truck, new boat engine, ATV skid mounted units or a washing machine gear extractor. Pasquale felt for the fee of \$1,050.00 there are no other obligations and the Authority can't lose. Carlton agreed. Hale mentioned Olin has worked for the City of White Cloud and they have been ecstatic with what he did.

IT WAS MOVED BY PASQUALE and supported by MAYER to approve the proposal from Land and Resources Engineering Inc. for \$1,050 to perform Grand Research for the Lowell Area Fire Department. Yes all. Motion carried.

- C. <u>Air Pac status review</u>. Martin stated he is still waiting to hear from the Grand Rapids Foundation.
- D. <u>2015/2016 budget discussion and municipal approval</u>. Herb questioned if the budgets were presented to the township and city boards. All accepted.

### 7. NEW BUSINESS

A. 2014/2015 Budget Amendments. Olin presented the 2014-2015 budget amendments.

IT WAS MOVED BY WITTENBACH and seconded by MAYER to approve the budget amendments amending the revenues by \$378,861.00 and the expenditures \$375,212.00. Yes – all. Motion Carried.

B. 1946 Seagrave truck buy/sell proposal. A sale agreement with David VanPutten for the purchase of a 1946 seagrave fire truck was presented. The buyer will pay for the truck with an exchange of services that includes three years of fire hose and hard suction testing and two years of fire ladder testing. Wittenbach questioned if this was separate from the pump test. Martin responded yes. Martin explained there is no good place to store the truck. Martin added Dave has promised to keep the City name on the truck and plans to have it in parades. Martin stated the seagrave has not been used since 1971.

IT WAS MOVED BY MAYER and seconded by REISTER to sell the 1946 Seagrave to David VanPutten, 3509 108<sup>th</sup> ST, S.E. Caledonia, MI for the sum of five thousand (\$5,000) USD paid for by providing the listed services as required in clause 4 of this Agreement. Yes – all. Motion Carried.

### 9. FIRE CHIEF REPORTS AND UPDATES.

Martin reported there were 13 fire incidents and 36 medical responses for the month of May 2015. The total for the first five months is 324 calls for the year. He added maintenance on the trucks is good. Herb questioned if there has been any mutual aid calls. Martin responded Saranac and Alto. Steve Bukala said currently he is the FOIA coordinator for the City of Lowell and FOIA requests must be responded to by 5 business days or you are subject to penalties. Bukala explained someone needs to coordinate the fire authority. He added come July 1 there are sweeping changes to the law.

IT WAS MOVED BY HERB and seconded by BLOUGH to appoint Corwin Velzen as the Lowell Area Fire Authority FOIA coordinator. Yes – all. Motion Carried.

Fire authority board:

We have had 28 fire incidents and 36 medical responses for the month of June, 2015, and 31 fire incidents and 45 medical responses for the month of July. The total for the first seven months is 464 calls.

Maintenance to the trucks has been the a/c needed repair on engine #6 and some lights replaced on the other trucks. During the truck driving rodeo eng # 5 did strike a post at the school property and the damage was around \$7200.00. County ins is covering the damage, but the authority has to pay the first \$1000.00.

All vehicle titles have been transferred to the Fire Authority

Deputy Chief VanOverbeek is overseeing the Medical and Fire reports that are sent to NFIRS. These reports are being completed by the Lieutenants.

Captain Witherell is doing the inspections and site plans, along with Lt. Corey Velzen.
